Hi ,

The Church of Scientology resides in my division in East Grinstead and is positioned along Saint Hill Road. I have attached a number of photographs that I have been sent which show the area in and around the entrance late last year where we had a protest outside during the time of their international convention which is fast approaching.

The pictures show various situations — ie the road as is normal and the footway outside the Church of Scientology is clear. And then photos where you can see protesters standing in the road because behind them the Church have placed huge planters on each side of their entrance which is outside of their boundary (judging by the enclosed maps) coupled large vehicles that can be seen parked behind and along what is a pedestrian footway. I can't fathom any reason as to why they would do this given this does not appear to be their land and it does cause an obstruction on the highway not just for anybody protesting but also other pedestrians — particularly those attending the event who are forced to walk in the road to get to it as many are parked in other car parks along that road.

Similarly, there are pictures depicting big banners put on the opposite verige.was once a footpath (see map attached) area but but it appears somebody has planted trees which now prohibits anybody using that space which from the pictures of the mapprovided appear to indicate that these trees are also planted on public highwandly with respect to a huge banner that is attached to these trees for the duration of the event – is this allowed given that this appears to be on public land?

Apparently a complaint was raised last year regarding this matter WSCC 563883905

I attach the resident below's email for information.

I am keen to avoid a repetition of last year's events this year and thus keen to ensure that the public highway/footpath is kept clear so that pedestrians and any future protesters can actually be safe along what is quite a precarious stretch at times.

Can you advise where the pub**lic** undary is and if it is as per the attached maps, what can we do to advise the Church of Scientology not to obstruct these areas. I am seriously hoping you are not going to ask me to report it to Op Crackdown on the day as it is likely they will not come out and take the view this is only a temporary issue.

We have recently been made aware of an event happening at Saint Hill Manor (home to the Church of Scientology) in East Grinstead.

The event occurs over the weekend of the 2527h October and is understood to attract up to 10,000 visitors to the site. Whilst the event does not encroach onto the highway it has been subject to protesting before with protesters occupying the highway at the entrance to Saint Hille Manor. road is a typical country two lane with minimal verges and no footways – save for a very small section directly outside the entrance to Saint Hill Manor.

I was first made aware of the event when contacted by an officer at Mid Sussex Council with reference to a potential application for a public space protection order (PSPO). The PSPO is entirely a District Council matter – although the County would be a consultee to any application. At present I understand that MSDC have no intention to go through the application process for a PSPO for this year's event.

Our understanding is that in 2023, when a similar event was held, the District granted an order under the Police and Town Clauses Act for a temporary closure of Saint Hill Road. MSDC may choose to implement a similar restriction this year.

No application for a temporary traffic regulation order to restrict traffic on the road has been received. Officer opinion is that this would not be a suitable device for the activity.


Officers have spoken to the police who are aware of the event and recognise it will need a police passtnisewill happen then the police will be in a position (and have the necessary powers) to manage traffic at the site – whether vehicular or on foot.

It has been reported that at last year's event the section of footway directly outside the entrance to Saint Hill Manor was blocked with temporary planters. These have subsequently been removed. (the areas is the section that is paved directly outside the pedestrian gate past the telegraph pole and through to the driveway visible in the picture below)

Officers are due to meet with the church soon to discuss this obstruction and the planting of trees opposite the entrance (the leylandii visible in the photo above) as this may be on highway and have been done without a licence.

I carried out a site visit yesterday (19/09/2024) of the privately planted hedge within the Highways extent opposite the access to the Church of Scientology, Saint Hill Road (adjacent to North Lodge).

Please see my photos attached to enquiry 503796. Direct Google Street View link to the site: https://maps.app.goo.gl/nRXdndqMX9hzMdJP7

On site I observed the following;

- The trees in question are *Cupressocyparis leylandii* (Leyland Cypress), a conifer species variety that have been planted at a consistent 0.80m from the edge of the carriageway to create a hedge that is 40m in length and now an average of 3-4m tall.
- The hedge appears to be maintained, but unlikely to be by WSCC.
- Immediately to the rear of the hedge is a metal fence and fence-posts, which I suspect is used to tie their fabric sign to.
- There is also wooden beam kerbing to the front (carriageway side) of the hedge. Due to
 the proximity of the trees/hedge, in time they will inevitably push and/or dislodge the
 beams due to root and trunk growth which will cause a hazard to the Highway, and some
 of them already appear to have done so.
- Maintenance would require an annual hedge trim cut back as a minimum, perhaps even bi-annual, requiring 3-way TM.
- These trees have the potential to grow to 20m+ in height, with a mature spread of 3-5m.
- MSDC even advise against planting this species of trees, let alone on the publicly maintainable Highway.

I understand that the Legal Team consider that it is not in the public interest to pursue the removal of these established trees. However, taking into consideration the low value of these trees, their unsuitability for the location, proximity to the carriageway, the maintenance involved and the potential hazards to the carriageway, I do not think we would want to adopt and/or maintain them going forwards. Therefore I would recommend their removal, along with the removal of the wooden beams and the fence to the rear.

If this is something we would consider, it may be in our interests to provide prior notice to EG Town Council and the Church of Scientology.

I can confirm that we would <u>not</u> be required to carry out a public consultation for their removal under exemptions within the new legislation of the 'Duty to Consult' S96A of the Highways Act 1980.



These trees that have been planted are certainly not ideal as they are look to a type of leylandii/confer which can be fast growing, also I note they have put in a kerb line. Someone has gone to some expense to do this. Maintenance of these would be expensive as they are so close to the road and would probably need trimming back often, not to mention if they were allowed to grow to any kind of height. To undertake this work traffic management would also be required, so one wonders who, when and with what equipment and what permissions (ie tm) these are being cut as they do look as if someone is maintaining them at this time, how long that will last, who knows. Ideally we would prefer that an owner be found and they be removed.

We map as many trees as we are able to, but no, the whole network is not mapped. In cases such as these, if maintenance is required the Arb will visit and if necessary make an asset on confirm under private works. A job would be raised on a without prejudice basis.

The main point to note for yourself and your team, is that several trees have been planted opposite the entrance to the Church of Scientology in East Grinstead, which falls within our Highway boundary. We do not know when or by whom the trees were planted, although according to Google imagery they were planted sometime between June 2011 and September 2016. After discussions with the Legal Team, it is considered not in the public interest to pursue the removal of these established trees and therefore, they will note that there is an obstruction on the highway but that we consider that it is not in the public interest to pursue at this time on the land charges map.

As a result, this would essentially mean we are adopting the trees which have been planted and Adam was conscious of putting this on yours and your team's radar. I do not know if we map every single tree within our network, but not being a tree expert myself, I have no idea which trees these are and whether they would fall under any maintenance or wider work programs in the future.

I have attached the original documentation we received from a resident, via ClIr Jacquie Russell which shows the trees and explains the issues in more detail; trees shown on page 2.


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


Please find attached a 1:1250 scale Ordnance Survey plan on which I have marked with a red line the limits of the publicly maintainable highway where this abuts Rockwood Park.

I have also indicated how the limits may be identified on site. It should be noted that the wooded are along the southern end of the frontage is currently overgrown and should be cut back. Our maintenance records indicate that a verge width of 1.2 - 1.3 metres should be available for use of the public.

I do not appear to have received a response to my email below, requesting a Teams or Zoom meeting. I am therefore sending it again, together with its attachment. I would be grateful for a reply today.

Since sending that email, I have also done further research regarding the extent of the Highway land where it borders our property at Saint Hill. It is, in fact quite clear that the plan that you sent us showing the Highway land in purple is not correct.

It appears instead that the Highway land on that border ends at the edge of the hard road. In particular, the whole of the bell mouth at the entrance to Saint Hill, including the paving slabs laid there belong to us, and are not part of the Highway. Similarly, the grass verge running down the hill towards the South Lodge, is also our property and not part of the Highway.

The current entrance gate to Saint Hill, including the paving around the bell mouth, was constructed in 1990 in accordance with a planning permission granted by Mid Sussex District Council on 8 th May 1990 – following full consultations with the County Surveyor and Highways. It was accepted by all parties that this construction was entirely on Church land, and no other permission was required from any other landowner. Prior to this the entrance had been directly next to North Lodge.

Prior to the construction of the new entrance the boundary fence ran along next to the road. The wall that was built by us was set back in order to improve visibility and also to provide an area down the side of the road which could occasionally be used for overflow parking when big functions occurred at the Church. The verge that was created by us has only ever been maintained by the Church. You will note that that verge does not exist further down towards South Lodge, nor along the entire length of the North Lodge land bordering the road.

Similarly, the small area of our paving outside of the entrance has only ever been maintained by the Church.

Also of interest is the fact that the planning permission allows us to put things on that paved area up to 60 cm above the level of the adjoining carriageway. That height restriction was intended to ensure that visibility lines were maintained for cars exiting the property through that gate.

Dear ,

Thank you for your letters dated 18th and 25 th September addressed to the Church of Scientology. I am the External Affairs Director, and am replying on their behalf.

I would like to organize a Teams or zoom meeting with you to discuss these matters more thoroughly. When would be good for you?

In the meantime, it appears that you have been misinformed concerning the hedge on the opposite side of Saint Hill Road to the Church entrance. This was put there on the specific recommendation of Inspector Paul Scott of Sussex Police more than 10 years ago, and was inspected and approved by West Sussex Highways at that time.

Before that was put there the bushes actually extended further into Saint Hill Road than is currently the case, and presented a greater danger to passing traffic than the neat hedge that is now there.

The problem with what was there before was that when there was an occasional protest outside of the Church, protestors would try to congregate there. They would push themselves into the bushes, but for most of the time ended up actually on the road – causing an obstruction and danger to passing traffic. This was why the police made the recommendation that they did, to us and the Rockwood Park residents. It is why the Highways Authority were also happy with it.

I have downloaded a few images of the site from Google Maps historical street view to demonstrate the improvement that this has made to the safety of the highway.

The first of these is from June 2011, and shows what the bush line used to be like. You will note the haphazard way in which branches poke out into the 60 mph road. This meant passing vehicles had to exercise care driving past, and difficult maintenance issues.

The next Google Street view image available was from September 2016 – some years after the hedge was planted. You will note the considerable improvement in the safety of the highway.

I have also enclosed the Google Streetview images from April 2017, May 2019 and May 2024. On all you can see the neat, easily maintained hedge – a vast improvement on what was there in 2011.

West Sussex highways not only approved it more than a decade ago, but clearly have had no issues with it since.

The person who has complained now is someone who wishes to be able to stand there protesting, obstructing the traffic and recreating the dangerous conditions that were the reason that the police recommended it in the first place.

Thank you for your email. I suggest that it would be helpful if would review their notes of our discussion on Tuesday last, which we have an accurate record of and is the basis of how we are proceeding.

I fully appreciate that West Sussex Highway authority is coming under a lot of pressure from people who wish only to discriminate and incite hatred against our religion. However, the Highway Authority needs to be very careful about attempts to be drawn into doing the same. This would not only be improper, but also illegal under our laws which protect against discrimination and mandate equal and proportionate treatment.

As your colleagues know, and I had hoped would have communicated to you, what we have done in this area, and as we discussed, and will do, was specifically done on the advice and recommendation of the police. They advised this as they observed people standing across from our entrance poking their heads out from the trees with cars passing by at 60 mph. It has been entirely concerned with improving safety while also containing unlawful public disorder from occurring on and next to this small area of highway.

The facts have been distorted by these few people and the highways authority should not allow itself to be used by people who wish only to discriminate and incite hatred based on religion, but should instead act in the proportionate and sensible way it has acted thus far.

Permitting people to stand on the Church's own property to shout at, intimidate and harass our members who are coming to their Church - is not right - no matter how someone might want to twist things.

To reiterate, the hedge opposite the Church entrance was planted more than a decade ago on the advice of Police Inspector Scott, because safety in that area of the highway was a serious risk because people were placing themselves in between the trees and would step onto the carriageway or poke their heads out that could easily have been hit by cars flying past. That was the frightening reality and it has obviously been seen by your authority many times in the intervening years without any issues being raised. As your colleagues know, it was specifically inspected by the Highway Authority on 29 April 2013, when your inspector told us the hedge was fine so long as we keep it trimmed. It was also inspected by you on 22 nd November 2023, when the same advice was given. Removing the hedge reverts back to that dangerous setup and I really don't think that is in anyone's best interest or what is wanted by anyone.

As we have said we are happy to continue to work with you to keep this area as safe as possible.

In relation to the other side, we are aware of the position regarding highways and ownership.

However, the evidence points to the area we laid paving slabs at the Church entrance, not being part of the Highway. As your colleagues are aware, and have no doubt now investigated for themselves, that entrance was constructed on the Church's land back in

1990, in accordance with a planning permission given by Mid Sussex District Council. The County Engineer was fully consulted, and at no time was it asserted that the area was part of the Highway, or that the permission of the Highways Authority was required for this work.

At that same time, we set back the wall that goes down towards the south gate, to improve sight lines.

What we do at our entrance, and what occurs from time to time down the side of the highway here, are all part of the normal life of our local community. There is nothing extraordinary about them, and they generally improve safety.

The Highway Authority needs to come and talk to us to resolve our very real concerns, and we will work together to address them, not write to us precipitously and without proper regard for the actual facts and history. They should not allow themselves to be used as part of a campaign by people who wish to destroy religion.

Can I therefore suggest that after we get through with this busy week, we get together again and reach agreement on matters? This was essentially what we agreed with your colleagues last Tuesday.

This land is not owned by the County Council, but the existence of highway rights over it means that it is under the control of this council as Highway Authority (HA) for West Sussex. Private ownership rights are irrelevant in these cases, as the highway rights always take precedence, and hence the Church is not permitted to interfere with the land without the consent of this council.
- As I understand it, we have not been presented with any evidence to the contrary, and therefore it would be an offence to position anything within the land shaded pink on the attached plans. Furthermore, if an incident/accident were to occur as a result of



Thank you for your email and my sincere apologies for the delay in responding. I wish to emphasise that we have no issue with any arrangements for ensuring that the hedge on the opposite side of the road is safe and appropriate for the Highway.

From your email below I note that you accept that it presented no problem as

recently as last November. In other words, from the time it was planted on the recommendation of Sussex Police, more than a decade ago, until this year, Highways have been happy with it. We have a record of the inspection having been done by Highways on 29 th April 2013, and the advice provided by Highways at that time – which I can share with you. But that may be immaterial if action is now needed to make it safe. I am happy to discuss with you the best way of dealing with it going forwards – bearing in mind that it was originally put there as a Highway safety measure. Maybe a wire fence could be placed along there? Or some other planting scheme?

However, I do wish to raise the point that, if you look all along the Highway down Saint Hill Road, you will note that this section provides better visibility than much of the rest of the road. That is because it is tidy and it is kept maintained. That leaves me with a strong suspicion that you singling out this specific section of the Highway is motivated by an anti-Scientology sentiment, and was not the genuine Highways' priority that your department's actions would indicate.

Indeed, this also appears strongly to be the case with your email below, dated 24th October 2024.

Because of this, I would be grateful if you would arrange for the email of 24th October in particular, but also your recent communications to us regarding Saint Hill Road, to be independently reviewed to ensure that the Highways Department has acted in compliance with the legal obligations of the Council under the Equality Act 2010.

As you know Scientology is a recognised religion in the United Kingdom, following the ruling of the Supreme Court in 2013. Moreover, the Church of Scientology premises on Saint Hill Road are a registered Public Place of Religious Worship. We are therefore concerned with the entrance to a recognised place of worship. As such it is a particularly sensitive area.

Under section 10 of the Equality Act, religion is a protected characteristic. Under section 13 it is unlawful discrimination to treat someone less favourably than one would treat others because of a protected characteristic. Section 149, states that the Council, as a public authority, "must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to ... eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or

under this Act".

On the face of it, you have failed to comply with this duty, in recent engagements with the Church concerning the Highway next to the place of religious worship on Saint Hill Road. This is why I would like this to be independently reviewed.

This is particularly highlighted by your email below, dated 24 October 2024, where you threaten the Church with instant draconian action and cost.

In that email you say:

"It has been brought to my attention that planters (shown in photos taken today) have been positioned on the highway in the vicinity of the Church.

I am providing notice that if they remain in place tomorrow, I will have them removed and stored at one of our highway depots. I will also seek to recover costs of undertaking this work from whoever is responsible for placing these unlawful obstructions on the highway. If I am not able to establish who placed them on the highway, they will be stored for a period of time and then disposed of.


If you are responsible for placing them on the highway – please organise for them to be removed by 10am tomorrow."

The two photographs provided show a small narrow planter right against the wall on one side and a line of planters demarking a walkway separate from the road on the other side. In fact, these had been put there in error, as the decision had been made not to have such planters (even though they had been specifically requested recommended by the police), and they were removed. But the fact that you would consider it appropriate to send such a draconian email is extremely troubling.

The following facts are relevant:

- 1. Notwithstanding the fact the Police Inspector had requested the planters be put there or he would have to put police officers there instead, The obstruction to the Highway presented by the planters in the photographs was trivial at best. There are hundreds of far worse examples all over East Grinstead at any given time. Yet you considered this so egregious that you were willing to spend Council money to immediately remove them, and threaten others with that cost. It is evident that this was only because they were placed at the entrance of the Church of Scientology in other words you were treating Scientologists less favourably than you treat others.
- 2. Your urgency in securing the removal of these trivial obstructions was only because you had received a complaint from an anti-Scientologist, and an agent for that anti-Scientologist, who wanted to stand in that area as part of an anti-Scientology protest coinciding with the International Association of Scientologists event taking place the next day. In other words your urgency was not driven by normal Highways priorities and concerns, but rather to facilitate an anti-Scientology protest at the entrance to the place of worship. This was direct discrimination.
- 3. The planters had been there in more abundance in earlier years. We were told by at our meeting with her on 15 th October 2024 that they were there specifically on the recommendation of the Police who would be policing the protest. The police considered that they improved public safety and order. In other words, your insistence on the immediate removal of the planters was <u>against</u> the wishes and advice of the police. Because the planters would be there on the advice of the police, there was clearly a lawful excuse for them to be there and no offence was committed under the Highways Act. Highways were well aware of this, but still you made the threat, at the instigation of the anti-Scientologist and his agent. That is harassment and discrimination contrary to section 149 of the Act.
- 4. Contrast this email with the one you sent to 23rd October. had pointed out to you in an email earlier on 23 rd October that as the police had designated a space for the protestors to hold their protest a little down the road (which also told us about at our meeting), that the protestors could not rely on the Human Rights Acts if they chose instead to obstruct the Highway at the entrance to the Church. You replied that "Unlawful use of the public highway in this context would be a matter for Sussex Police". Yet, according to you, it was not a matter for the Sussex Police, when it came to members of the Church doing something at their entrance.

5.	At the meeting with and and one of the commended that planters be put there, we indicated to her that we would put them there again this year. They made no objection to this at all. Although we subsequently changed our mind, you were not to know that, and your letter represented a complete volte face by the Council – as a result, apparently of further pressure put on you by the anti-Scientologist.
	My conclusion is that you have treated us less favourably because of our religion. If you have, then you have acted unlawfully under the Equality Act, and this is why I ask you to arrange for it to be independently reviewed by an appropriate person at the Council. Scientologists are entitled to the same treatment as other religions – and I think if you substitute a Jewish Synagogue and an anti-Jew for Scientology in the above facts it helps to emphasise the breaches of the Act.

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

As you may be aware, West Sussex County Council is the Highway Authority for West Sussex and as such, has a duty to assert and protect the rights of the public to the use and enjoyment of the highway under the provisions of the Highways Act 1980.

It has been brought to our attention that a banner and planters were erected on the highway last year advertising your church's annual event. I should point out that, unfortunately, this is classed as an unlawful obstruction of the highway, so I should be very grateful if you would kindly make alternative arrangements this year to avoid depositing or erecting anything on the highway. For your assistance, I attach a plan showing the extent of publicly maintainable highway in the vicinity of the access to the Church in pink. I would also add that it might also be advisable to contact the District Council to ensure that no advertising regulations are broken by the erection of the banner.

Please feel free to contact me to discuss this matter further should you so wish.

The Church of Scientology resides in my division in East Grinstead and is positioned along Saint Hill Road. I have attached a number of photographs that I have been sent which show the area in and around the entrance late last year where we had a protest outside during the time of their international convention which is fast approaching.

The pictures show various situations – ie the road as is normal and the footway outside the Church of Scientology is clear. And then photos where you can see protesters standing in the road because behind them the Church have placed huge planters on each side of their entrance which is outside of their boundary (judging by the enclosed maps) coupled large vehicles that can be seen parked behind and along what is a pedestrian footway. I can't fathom any reason as to why they would do this given this does not appear to be their land and it does cause an obstruction on the highway not just for anybody protesting but also other pedestrians – particularly those attending the event who are forced to walk in the road to get to it as many are parked in other car parks along that road.

Similarly, there are pictures depicting big banners put on the opposite verge. This was once a footpath (see map attached) area but but it appears somebody has planted trees which now prohibits anybody using that space which from the pictures



I was hoping to have a polite discussion with him rather than be challenged upon my personal observations last year as the local councillor let alone remind me of the law and point out the responsibilities of the Highways authority as if I'm not aware of this. He was dismissive in tone so I'm surprised he reached out via yourself in the first place. That conversation won't occur now but I will respond to his points in his email and I am happy to copy you in on this.

Inspector has practically implied that you should allow those planters to remain because it means he doesn't have to put police by the entrance – but police were there at the entrance by the planters last year and the protesters were nowhere near – but the planters and vans being in situ did make it really unsafe for attendees walking up the road dodging traffic entering the venue let alone people trying to exercise their right to protest.

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

I accept what you are saying re the planters, but I do feel that we should request it in the interests of pedestrian safety particularly as the police do have powers to restrict where protesters can stand. I do not accept Inspector comment that he would support them being there as it means he doesn't have to put police officers there because they were standing there last year alongside numerous security officers with protesters much further down the road on the edge of the grass verge which I understand from yourselves is public land.

If they ignore the request, then its not going to go down well with respect to their application for a public space protection order given that is all about protecting the public spaces and the people within those spaces.

I have written to Inspector as you will have seen and I have asked him whether or not the police have engaged with the protesters as I feel this will go a long way towards minimising further disruption outside of the obvious traffic issues that will prevail during the 3 day event. Following the meeting with Inspector last week, he has confirmed that Sussex Police will be in attendance throughout the Church of Scientology's Annual Convention, to ensure the safety of any protestors, attendees to the Church's event and users of the highway. Given the limited width of the footway at this location and the speed of the road, there will be specific areas that protestors are permitted to stand across the weekend, to ensure their safety.
He has confirmed that all Police officers will be wearing body worn cameras, any vehicles which are obstructing the footway and posing a risk to the public are to be removed and that arrests will be undertaken, if protestors obstruct the highway and endanger themselves or those around them. The safety of the public is the paramount concern throughout this event and ultimately, any enforcement surrounding this lies with Sussex Police.
Inspector has confirmed that he is happy to discuss this matter further with you, if you wish and I have included his contact details below for your reference:

I hope you are well.

I was wondering if you could please assist me with the following.

We have been advised that the Church of Scientology in East Grinstead have an annual event which is due to go ahead the weekend commencing 25th October until 27th October 2024 and following reported incidents last year of the highway being obstructed and protestors being forced into the road, we are keen to ensure this does not happen again and that the safety of the public is considered.

Last year during the above convention, the Church obstructed the public highway by placing planters directly outside of their entrance and we have been informed that vehicles were parked on the public footway, leading to protestors having to walk into the carriageway to get around these vehicles.

has informed me that she believes the planters are usually placed outside of the entrance the evening before the event commences, which in this case would be Friday 24th October.

Given the nature of last year's event, we feel a Police presence will be required to ensure the highway is not obstructed and ultimately that the safety of the public is maintained throughout the convention.

For your information, we have also had notification that the Place and Communities committee at Mid Sussex District Council met on Wednesday 2nd October and agreed to pursue a consultation into a public space protection order being put in place outside the church. West Sussex County Council are waiting to be consulted on this.

If you could please come back to me as soon as possible it would be greatly appreciated, as the event is coming around quickly and please do let me know if I should direct my enquiry to another member of the Team, instead of yourself.

I do not accept Inspector comment that he would support them being there as it means he doesn't have to put police officers there because they were standing there last year alongside numerous security officers with protesters much further down the road on the edge of the grass verge which I understand from yourselves is public land.

If they ignore the request, then its not going to go down well with respect to their application for a public space protection order given that is all about protecting the public spaces and the people within those spaces.

I have written to Inspector as you will have seen and I have asked him whether or not the police have engaged with the protesters as I feel this will go a long way towards minimising further disruption outside of the obvious traffic issues that will prevail during the 3 day event. I have also asked him to ensure he will move on the many vans that were most definitely obstructing what your team have identified as public footway as his email seemed to be focussed entirely on where protesters would be arrested. I don't like one rule for one and one for the rest of us. All I want is a level playing field so that the Church can have a successful event, pedestrians are safe and the protesters can exercise their right to protest peacefully.

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
